KITTEN VISIT #2

Welcome to your kitten's second check-up! We hope you are enjoying your new kitten. Continuing to provide high quality nutrition and maintaining kitten vaccine protection will help ensure a healthy beginning to your relationship.

VACCINATIONS

FVRCP: booster inoculation against Feline Rhinotracheitis, Calicivirus, Panleukopenia, & Pneumonitis. This combined vaccine will continue temporary protection against these serious diseases. The final booster is necessary in 1 month.

FeLV: Booster inoculation against Feline Leukemia Virus for outdoor cats and those exposed to strays.

FLEAS & TICKS

ALL kittens in our area will be exposed to fleas and ticks. To kill fleas and ticks for cats over 8 weeks, we recommend FRONTLINE GOLD. Frontline Gold is translocated through your pet's oil glands. We recommend this product be used monthly.

HEARTWORMS

Heartworms can infest cats. We don't see heartworm disease in cats as often as we do in dogs, but preventative is available on our Online Store if you choose to protect them.

INTESTINAL PARASITES

If a fecal test has not been performed in the last month, it is crucial to examine it at this visit. IF parasites are detected, you will be provided treatment and we will need a subsequent fecal test at the third kitten visit to be assured that treatment was effective in ridding those parasites.

DENTAL CARE

Continue to handle your kitten's mouth and lips. It is beneficial to begin brushing your pet's teeth at this time. Daily brushing with pet-specific toothpaste is really the best way to keep your pet's mouth healthy. You can find a variety of pet toothpaste on our Online Store. Routine dental care with brushing will prevent many of the middle age health problems that develop secondary to tartared and infected teeth.

KITTEN DEVELOPMENT

Nutrition: We continue to recommend PURINA PRO PLAN and PURINA brand products as they are excellent premium foods widely available.

Litter Box: Remember to scoop out or clean the litter box daily to encourage clean habits.

Coat Care: Continue brushing your kitten's coat to keep it in nice condition and minimize shredding and hairballs.

Nail Care: If you have any questions about declawing, bring it to the attention of the Veterinarian or Technician.

NEXT VISIT – ONE MONTH

Your kitten should have its final check-up and its boosters in 3-4 weeks. It is very important to follow the correct series of vaccine visits to completely protect your puppy from these diseases, as well as getting the Doctor's advice on continued kitten care.

EMERGENCY CARE

Please contact the *PAW Health Network Animal Emergency Center* in Mosinee at 715-693-6934. The Emergency Center's standards of care most closely mirror Woodland Veterinary Clinic, Ltd. They are open from 6pm – 8am, Monday – Thursday; and 5pm Friday – 8am Monday; as well as holidays. From Wisconsin Rapids, it should take about 45 minutes to get there.
